- Davey Elliott reported that the Remembrance Day service will be in Freeport again this year. It will be outside at the cenotaph with a small gathering at the Legion afterward. If you want to bring your wreath to Tiverton after the service to lay at our cenotaph at the cemetery, you are welcome to do so.
- Helen thanked the Village Commission for supporting Jonathan Riley's grant application for improving the Bear Cove Art Trail. The Commission has agreed to donate \$500 towards the project if the grant is approved.
- Heather mentioned that the gate at the cemetery needs to be realigned or adjusted. Richie volunteered to help do this and Susan will ask around for a few volunteers to help.
- This will be the last meeting until February 2, the first Wednesday in February.
