Susan submitted her letter of resignation as commissioner.

Mary read the minutes. They were approved as amended.

No **Financial Report** as the books are at the auditors. It will be two months before they are returned.

### Old Business

- Carl Cole has looked at the cemetery and will put in a quote for removing the rocks and clearing the road at the back, etc.
- The only bid received for cleaning the hall was from Heather and Melissa for \$400/month, \$4800/year, \$20/hour for each person.
- Access Nova Scotia met with the commissioners to discuss possible grant money that may be available for things like enclosure for the ramp outside, etc.

### New Business

- Discussion about installing a propane generator that turns on and off automatically so the hall can be a comfort/warming station when the power is out.
- We have over \$102 000 at present with \$11 000 in a GIC so rates will remain the same.
- The sign for the hall is being repaired but we are considering an electronic sign this time.
- Helen announced that ACOA awarded a grant for \$8 000 for the art trail.
- Propane stoves will require 2 plugs to be wired into the generator box to light the pilot light.

Next meeting, the AGM will Apr. 6 at 7 p.m.
