Old business

- Putting a basketball court at the far end of the baseball field proved to be quite expensive. An alternative would be to put it at the end of the fire pond.
- The cemetery quote to clear rocks from the back to clear the roadway, etc has not yet been received from Carl. Helen suggested we get other quotes.
- Electronic sign has not yet been priced. Heather said they were approximately \$900 and up. Quotes for electronic single/double as well as signs with changeable letters as we had before will be available at the next meeting.
- No EHS money is available for the automatic generator. Kendall will ask J.D. electric to come give an estimate on the generator and installation.
- Entryway needs shingling, siding needs to be replaced. Timmy Crocker will do these things.
- Insurance--\$2 800

New business

- The Tiverton board of Trade has received a grant for a 12-week summer job. They will not receive the funds until later, so they requested a temporary loan of \$2 495.16 until the remainder of the cost is sent to the board of Trade. The province's share is \$3 822. The Commissioners agreed.
- We received a letter from Gwen Wilson asking for a letter of support for their group, St. Mary's Bay Protectors Association, to protect the Bay.
- The brook through the village needs cleaning. A beaver dam as well as debris has become a problem.
- We discussed creating a Fishermen's Memorial across from Kevin Leeman's house. It could be graveled, and picnic tables placed there for now with plans to for a memorial stone with the names of those lost at sea to be added later. Perhaps the cost could be shared between the village and municipality. A lobster raffle was suggested as a possible fundraiser.
- There is a clean-up planned for Boar's Head and along the shore for June 9th. The O2 class will be helping with this but others are invited to join them.

Next meeting will be July 6th, after Grant Thornton returns the books.
